

Celebrating 80 years



Sister Melvina Pausina entered the School Sisters of Notre Dame from St. Louis Cathedral Parish in New Orleans. Her original ministries were community service assignments, first in the aspiranture at the St. Louis Motherhouse and then at St. Mary of the Pines in Chatawa, Miss. In 1951, Sister Melvina began her 31 years of ministry as an elementary teacher in Missouri, Louisiana, California, Texas and Arkansas. In 1982, she left the classroom to rejoin staff at St. Mary of the Pines. At age 91, Sister Melvina officially retired from full-time ministry. She continues to serve the SSND community through prayer and hospitality at 101 years of age!

I am blessed with time to pray, to say many short indulgenced prayers and to make little sacrifices. From time to time, I stop to be quiet and say the rosary. I say many rosaries during the day, asking Mother Mary for her help. I know I always have Mary's help when I call on her, night or day. I know that through prayer, you get what you are praying for.

Sister Bernita Wasinger has ministered as a teacher and principal in Missouri for 29 years. Sister also served as coordinator of religious education and pastoral ministry in Missouri and Illinois. She was the associate superintendent for the Diocese of Jefferson City, Mo. Currently, she is a pastoral minister at St. Martin in Jefferson City. Sister Bernita received a bachelor's degree in theology from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis and a master's degree in elementary administration from St. Louis University.

A blessing of these years I want to share is all the people I have gotten to know and with whom I have ministered. They have been an inspiration and a blessing to me. I still smile at the wonderful experiences

I have had with them. God is good.

The wisdom I would like to share is to have a good laugh frequently and smile a lot. It makes life brighter, friendlier and really enjoyable. Be happy. Sister Thomasin Sergot began her ministry as a teacher in LaCrescent, Minn. For 16 years she served at the primary and intermediate levels and as a school administrator in Jordan, Red Wing, Prior Lake and Lonsdale in Minnesota. In 1979, Sister Thomasin shifted her focus to pastoral ministry and religious education, serving the next 22 years at parishes in North Branch, Kenyon, Montevideo, Springfield and St. Peter in Minnesota. In 2002, Sister became the manager of Highlands on Graham Retirement Center in St. Paul, Minn. In 2006, she joined the staff at East Side Learning Center (ESLC), a program that provides free, one-on-one tutoring for children who read below grade level. A former lead teacher and board member, she currently ministers as the St. Matthew School site coordinator to ESLC.

Sister Judy Fleisner served as an elementary school teacher at St. Mary in Menasha, Wis., and at Bruce-Guadalupe, Catholic East Elementary, St. Helen and Holy Wisdom Academy in Milwaukee. Currently, she is a fourth grade teacher at Notre Dame Middle School in Milwaukee.

I am blessed by the opportunities I have had that caused personal growth in my spiritual life, community life and personal life. Right from the beginning, I was challenged to work in areas different from my usual routine. I volunteered in shelters for battered women, doing day care for the children who were uprooted with their mothers because of abuse. I taught English as a second language to refugees from

SISTER MELISSA SCHREIFELS PROFESSES FINAL VOWS



On July 28, 2012, at Our Lady of Good Counsel campus in Mankato, Minn., Sister Melissa Schreifels vowed forever to live simply, faithfully and in service to God through her vows of poverty, celibacy and obedience.

Although Sister Melissa's journey as a School Sister of Notre Dame began in 2002, she was no stranger to the congregation, having been taught by them as a primary student at St. Francis Xavier Catholic School in her hometown of Sartell, Minn. "I was taught by the Sisters in first, second and third grade," said Sister Melissa. "One of the Notre Dames was the principal as well."

Attending college at St. Scholastica in Duluth, Minn., and then Creighton University in Omaha, Neb., she graduated in 1992 with a degree in pharmacy. For the next 10 years she worked as a pharmacist in managed care and retail pharmacies in Omaha. In 2002, Melissa took a job offer at Target in Minneapolis, Minn. That summer, she reconnected with the SSNDs at a Search and Discover Retreat. "I was looking for something," she said about attending the vocation weekend. "I wasn't sure what I wanted or what I would find." Melissa became an SSND affiliate in December 2002, a postulant in 2003 and a novice in 2004. She professed her first vows on August 4, 2006 as a member of the Mankato Province.

In 2008, while practicing pharmacy on a part-time basis, Sister Melissa began her education to become a math teacher. "Teaching has always been my dream," she said. "I am blessed to be able to pursue that dream."

Within a few classes of completing her master's degree in instruction, Sister Melissa ministers as a middle school math teacher at St. Michael Catholic School in Prior Lake, Minn. "I love teaching middle school students," she shared. "They ask so many questions and I really like being able to show them that in the

future they will need the math skills they are learning now. Being a sister teaching at St. Michael is great. The kids have lots of questions about religious life. For some of them, I am the first sister they have ever seen. It is a wonderful opportunity to be able to share with them religious life as a vocation option. In fact, I have invited students and their parents to my final profession."

In addition to teaching, Sister Melissa will continue her part-time ministry as a pharmacist. "I want to keep up my license. Continuing education is important to me and this is one way I can do that."

As for her thoughts about religious life, Sister Melissa believes that being part of a community is the best part. "I feel such support from the SSND community. I believe I am blessed to be able to share stories, ministries and especially prayer – first with the Mankato sisters and now with the sisters of the Central Pacific Province. Although I entered the SSNDs through the Mankato Province, I have the history of being part of the interprovincial novitiate. From the beginning I was part of the whole. I am honored to have professed my final vows as a School Sister of Notre Dame, and I look forward to sharing my energy and my perspective as a newly professed sister."

Transforming the world through education

SISTERS AND THEIR MINISTRIES

School Sisters of Notre Dame exist for the mission of Jesus. They carry out this mission daily in their ministries. Here are a few examples of the positive influence sisters have on the lives of many. Each day, they make a difference.



Sisters Mary Beckman and Kathy Stark direct activities at St. Augustine Wellston Center in St. Louis. With Sister Carol Ann Callahan, a Sister of Mercy, they strive to meet needs of the community through a food pantry that provides for more than 400 families a month and a busy thrift store. "Working with and loving the families we serve have made us what we are today. Low income people have taught us so much about what is important in life, who God is, the importance of family, how to handle suffering and how to laugh and enjoy the simple things in life," Sister Mary said.



Sister Mary Kay Brooks lives in the Postulant community in Chicago. She teaches mathematics at St. Ignatius College Preparatory, Chicago. Being the only SSND and the only vowed woman religious in her place of ministry is both challenging and wonderful for her. "For over 14 years, I have been blessed with experiences to collaborate closely with colleagues in providing varied opportunities for students to move out of their comfort level, try new things, think differently and discover who they are becoming." The students, in turn, challenge Sister Mary Kay to "walk the talk" in living the beliefs and values she proclaims.



Sister Margaret Mary Friesenhahn chairs the Foreign Language Department and teaches Latin and Spanish at Xavier University Preparatory, New Orleans. Sister Margaret Mary shares stories with her students of SSND foundress, Blessed Theresa Gerhardinger, and the SSND conviction that the world can be changed through the transformation of persons. One of the most transformative moments for Sister came after Hurricane Katrina breeched the levees and flooded New Orleans, shuttering most schools for the fall semester of 2005. The following January, two schools serving primarily African-American students shared the Xavier campus. "I was profoundly touched at the incredible display of faith and resilience expressed by the students and their parents. Flood waters robbed them of their material homes. Yet nothing could rob them of their faith in an all loving God," said Sister Margaret Mary. The cooperation among the students and staff witnessed what can happen when people direct their gifts toward building the earth...with the conviction that the world can be changed through the transformation of persons.

Although Our Lady of Mount Carmel Convent in Mount Calvary, Wis., closed after 160 years of SSND presence, Sisters Mary Beck and Mary Ann Srnka's commitment to the earth continues. They have assured that some of the Mount Carmel "holy land" is transforming part of the lawn into a bountiful vegetable and flower garden at their new home in Green Bay, Wis.

The sisters' skills and knowledge benefit the "Homegrown Project" which aims to help low income residents grow, prepare and preserve food. "We've done extensive workshops on preserving foods, baking breads, making jams and jellies...skills younger generations may have lost," said Sister Mary Ann. "It's time to revive these skills that care for the earth," Sister Mary said. Although the Green Bay project may not have chickens, the worms have found a new home, and are adjusting well, as are the sisters!



CELEBRATING OUR SISTERS



Sister Carol Ann Collins was one of the honorees at the Alzheimer's Association of St. Louis' annual recognition dinner for volunteers on June 13. She received a plaque in recognition of her five years of service in the St. Louis Chapter's "Let's Talk" program. Sister Carol Ann assists individuals in early-stage

Alzheimer's as they make bi-monthly personal and supportive phone calls to others who are themselves experiencing the onset of Alzheimer's disease. She served in this position for 24 years.



Sister Janet Crane received a doctor of ministry degree from Eden Theological Seminary in Webster Groves, Mo. Her research and dissertation is entitled, "Lived Religion: Spirituality and Community as Resources and Sources for Elderly Catholic Sisters." honor of Sister Caroleen who was appointed superintendent of schools for the diocese in 1967.




Sister Jeanne Goessling
