4. User-Friendly Interfaces

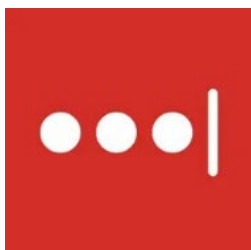
There are several password manager apps that are designed to be easy to use and make navigation simple. This includes large fonts, clear instructions, and straightforward layouts.
