## Sister Suzanne Moynihan, SSND

Sister Suzanne is originally from Sheboygan, Wisconsin, and in 1961, made first profession in Mequon, Wisconsin. She began her teaching ministry in 1963 at St. Cyril and Methodius, Milwaukee. In 1967, she received a bachelor's degree in English from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. She taught for six years at St. Agnes, Butler, Wisconsin, and six years at Sacred Heart, Calumet, Michigan. In 1977, she earned a master's degree in religious studies from Mundelein College, Chicago. Beginning in 1978, Sister Suzanne served as director of religious education at Holy Cross, Milwaukee, and then at St. Michael, Marquette, Michigan. She returned to Milwaukee in 1984, to serve as the initial global education coordinator for the former Milwaukee province until the position moved into half-time when she also served as secretary at Bruce-Guadalupe School. From 1989



to 1992, Sister Suzanne was coordinator of education for the northside Milwaukee Achiever Literacy Program. After a sabbatical, she went to Washington state, serving as director of religious education and pastoral minister at St. Mary Mission, Omak, Colville Reservation and then spent one year serving in social services for Carroll Children's Center, Yakima. After her return to Milwaukee in 1998, Sister Suzanne was the executive director for the Women's and Children Project, Inc. From 2001 to 2007, she taught at St. Vincent Pallotti School, Milwaukee, and then was education coordinator for Sunseed Eco-Education Center, Mount Calvary, Wisconsin. This program morphed into Education Dreams for a New Era (EDGE), located in Elm Grove, Wisconsin, where Sister Suzanne served as director from 2013 to 2015. She is currently engaged as a volunteer ecology advocate in Milwaukee.
