- Integrate Gospel nonviolence explicitly into our everyday lives.

Readings Job 12:7-10 Colossians 1:15-17 Laudato Si' (233)

Ponder and Share

- 1. How do these mystical expressions of all creation's unity in Christ relate to today's understanding of scientific realities?
- **2.** The ideal is to discover God in all things. When and where have you discovered God present in the realities and experiences of creation.

Prayer response: (adapted from) A Christian Prayer in Union with Creation

Triune God, wondrous community of infinite love, teach us to contemplate you in the beauty of the universe, for all things speak of you.

Awaken our praise and thankfulness for every being that you have made.

Give us the grace to feel profoundly joined to everything that is.

God of love, show us our place in this world as channels of your love for all creatures of this earth for not one of them is forgotten in your sight.
